Essity is fully aware of the requirements under the REACH Regulation and has established robust procedures and routines to ensure that our products are safe for both people and the environment—now and in the future.

Our hygiene products have a long-standing history of safe use by millions of people worldwide. We are fully compliant with all applicable legislation in the countries where we operate.


The European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) maintains a continuously updated Candidate List of Substances of Very High Concern (SVHCs). Based on the most recent update, none of the materials used in Essity's products—including packaging—contain any SVHCs at concentrations equal to or greater than 0.1% w/w, as defined by REACH (1).

We are also actively working with our suppliers to ensure that all substances in mixtures and articles are registered in accordance with REACH requirements. Any presence of SVHCs is communicated transparently, as required. Furthermore, the materials we use comply with the restrictions outlined in Annex XVII and do not include substances subject to authorisation under Annex XIV of REACH.

Regarding the SCIP database introduced by ECHA, we confirm that none of our products or articles fall under the scope of this requirement (2).

Companies supplying articles containing substances of very high concern (SVHCs) on the Candidate List in a concentration above 0.1% weight by weight (w/w) on the EU market have to submit information on these articles to ECHA, as from 5 January 2021.
